Dear colleagues,

The aims of the ESPE Summer School are to provide up to date teaching in some selected areas of paediatric endocrinology, to promote discussions and interactions between younger and senior paediatric endocrinologists and to prepare the next leaders in paediatric endocrinology.

The course extends over 3 days and is composed of lectures, discussions and interactive case presentations. In 2019, it will be held at **Burg Feistritz am Wechsel, a medieval secluded castle 1 hour south from Vienna**, immediately before the 58th Annual Meeting of the European Society for Paediatric Endocrinology in Vienna.

The Summer School fellows usually consist of physicians **still in academic training in paediatric endocrinology**, who are selected by the Summer School Steering Committee. **Applicants must have had at least one year of clinical training in Paediatric Endocrinology. Applicants should not have previously attended the Summer School.** The application form and further information is now available on the ESPE Summer School website. Applications should include a CV with publications and a letter of recommendation by a current supervisor and **a letter of recommendation by a member of ESPE if the current supervisor is not a member.** All applications need to be sent directly to the Summer School coordinator.

The **deadline** will be **February 8th, 2019** and applicants will be notified by the middle of April 2019.

There is no registration fee for the Summer School and travel between Vienna and the Summer School and accommodation on the nights of the 15th, 16th and 17th September and associated meals shall also be provided.
